LETTER FROM THE DEAN OF PETERBOROUGH

May sees us celebrating two great festivals of the Church – Ascension and Pentecost.

Like Good Friday and Easter Day they are inextricably linked. In a sense, of course, all the great festivals linked to the salvation story are dependent one upon another – for just as the Risen Christ bears on his body the marks of his crucifixion, not just to prove who he is but to demonstrate the cost of the cross and the redeeming character of the Easter experience, so too the Ascension is the prerequisite to Pentecost. "Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you." (John 16:7)

Jesus' ascension is the ultimate sign of his authority but it is also the point at which the Holy Spirit is poured out into the world to empower Christ's disciples (then and now) to be bearers of God's love to his needy world. Someone asked me recently: "Why couldn't Jesus have stayed a bit longer – teaching and helping to put us straight about where we stand with God?" In a sense Pentecost is the answer. After Pentecost, Jesus' spirit is poured into the hearts and lives of all believers – we are all caught up in his grace and all commissioned and empowered to go out and bear much fruit.

We may often feel pretty inadequate and ill-equipped for such a task, but it is the calling of all the baptised people of God. Of course we must be prepared to open ourselves to God's grace. Before his Ascension Jesus told his disciples to "wait in the city until you receive the power from on high".

So they did as he said. They waited and prayed, and when the day of Pentecost had fully come they were indeed flooded with Holy Spirit and enflamed with the fire of God's love. What had been a tiny group of confused and fearful men and women became a movement that changed the world.

And God is still transforming lives and communities and – through them – the world. We are invited to be a part of that transformation. We are called to wait and watch and pray for the gift of God's spirit wherever we are – in city, town or village – and we have been invited to set aside the period between Ascension and Pentecost as a special opportunity to pray for God to act in and through us to bring hope and healing to the world.

We would do well to respond. We often resort to prayer when all else fails – let us remember this May to place it at the very centre of lives – and maybe something wonderful will happen!

WORKS PROGRESS

Work has been carried throughout March and April to repair the internal damage to the church following the theft of the roof in November 2015. It has taken longer than expected as the bad weather has delayed the drying of the new plaster needed to replace old plaster damaged by water ingress. Also with interior scaffolding it has been possible to examine the roof and clerestory windows for the first time in years. This has revealed new death watch beetle infestations in the roof (that has now been treated)

and very fragile medieval glass that has had to be repaired. Despite these setbacks we expect the church to be open for visitors by the May bank holiday weekend and for the scheduled services in May.

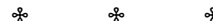
